
CONTRIBUTING BUILDING (NR 5D)

Sited at 8065 Valencia Street, at the junction of Valencia and Bernal Streets is the Calvary Chapel Aptos Church constructed circa 1952. This building displays few characteristics associated with any architectural style.

This church building of frame construction is clad in wide lap siding. Sheltered beneath the intersecting gable roof - sheathed in composition shingles - is the church's T-shaped floor plan. Beneath deep overhanging eaves are exposed rafter tails. One of the most prominent features of this church is the tall steeple that rises from the small square tower located at one corner of the junction of the walls; a cross-shaped window further delineates this tower. Fenestration consists primarily of panel wood doors, single-lite windows with hopper style transom, and one-over-one casement windows with diamond lites located in the top pane. (Continued page 2)

Located on the longest section of the "T" are planters made out of wood, which on each end of the front facing elevation. In front of the church is a kiosk that displays information about church services.

Some of the historic residential buildings within the neighborhood have been converted into office or business space. The housing stock is a mixture of historic and new construction. The Works Progress Administration (WPA) installed the sidewalks and curbing (1940) located throughout the neighborhood. Historic vegetation permeates the neighborhood in conjunction with non-historic vegetation. Despite the new construction, this small, primarily residential neighborhood still possesses a sense of place.

This church possesses integrity of location, setting, design, feeling, association, workmanship, and materials as it remains true to its historic design and appearance. It is a contributing resource to the Aptos Village Historic District.

History

The building now housing the Calvary Chapel at 8065 Valencia Street was constructed in the early 1950s. Initially, the church was called the Aptos Community Methodist Church. The church was built on the site of the Charles H. Winslow home, which had previously burned. A small building lived in by Mary Brown in the late 1920s was located on the now vacant lot to the west of the church (8063 Valencia Street). A Methodist minister and former missionary in China, Mrs. Brown held church services and Sunday school in her home. By the early 1950s, the Aptos Methodist Church had acquired both parcels.
