This small two story vernacular farm house with one story shed addition at the side is rectangular in shape. The front facing gabled roof is composition shingle. Windows are wood frame, double hung and asymmetrically placed on each side of a central door which is sheltered by a porch. Windows on the shed addition are in a group of three with a small window on either side of a long narrow one. Siding is board and batten on the first story and shiplap on the second story and addition. The house is surrounded by redwoods, fruit trees and a rustic garden.

Glen Canyon, known as Squabble Hollow until the 1880s, has a colorful history involving numerous boundary disputes which gave it its name. Early maps of the area show the area divided into small family owned parcels, a configuration that remains today. This property is significant because it is an apparently unaltered example of the family farm house common to this area during the period. A simple, sturdy box constructed from local redwood lumber, it could be added to and expanded as the family's need for space increased. Decorative elements, such as the shutters or the unusual window configuration, were added to personalize the simple form. Adding to the significance of this property is the setting with its fruit trees, flower and vegetable gardens which are both practical and decorative.
